

8. If inspectors detect irregularities which may give rise to doubts they will report the irregularities to the representatives of the facility and the National Authority and request that the situation be resolved. Uncorrected irregularities will be reported to the Executive Council.

9. After the completion of each period of destruction the Technical Secretariat shall certify the declaration of the National Authority, reporting the completion of destruction of the designated quantity of chemical weapons.

VI. [VERIFICATION OF DECLARATIONS AND INTERIM MONITORING OF CHEMICAL WEAPONS STOCKPILES] \*/

(a) specifies any chemical weapons production facilities, including a state's own production facilities, for the time of entry into force of the Convention, and any other facilities which may be established or operated after that date;

(b) specifies any transfer or any change of control of chemical weapons (and documentation relevant to the production of chemical weapons) which is necessary for the verification of the declaration;

(c) specifies actions to be taken for each element of each chemical weapons production facility, including any transfer or change of control, to ensure that the information required for verification is available;

(d) outlines the general plan for destruction for each chemical weapons production facility, and the general plan for destruction for any chemical weapons stockpile;

(e) outlines the general plan for any necessary conversion of chemical weapons production facilities to peaceful purposes, and any other necessary measures to ensure that the information required for verification is available;

10. Each State Party shall, immediately after the declaration, under paragraph 9, have submitted to the Executive Council, through the Technical Secretariat, a declaration of the production of chemical weapons, and a declaration of the destruction of chemical weapons, and a declaration of the conversion of chemical weapons production facilities to peaceful purposes, and any other necessary measures to ensure that the information required for verification is available.

11. The State Party shall, immediately after the declaration, under paragraph 9, have submitted to the Executive Council, through the Technical Secretariat, a declaration of the production of chemical weapons, and a declaration of the destruction of chemical weapons, and a declaration of the conversion of chemical weapons production facilities to peaceful purposes, and any other necessary measures to ensure that the information required for verification is available.

12. It is understood that the above provisions also apply to any facility on the territory of another State production of chemical weapons, on the basis of which they have been set up and functioned for the purpose of production of chemical weapons, and to any other facility which may be established or operated after that date.

\*/ Some delegations believe it is necessary to elaborate principles and methods for verifying chemical weapons declarations and for monitoring chemical weapons stockpiles from the time of their declaration until their elimination.
