- 27. Submit for the consideration of the General Meeting and the Executive Committee, the plans and reports on the development of programs, being responsible for the entire activities of the Center.
- 28. To sign public or private documents, minutes, and public deeds as required to perform the duties described in the previous paragraphs. The signature of the Director General will suffice in all these cases.
- 29. Exercise all the abilities that are compatible with the functions that performs and with that settled down by the law and the statutes, as well as to perform the responsibilities conferred in each case by the General Meeting by means of granting powers to their favor.
- 30. Delegate any of the functions that are granted in this article in the person or people that it designates, revoke it and resume the representation when estimates convenient, being able to authorize the commissioners to delegate everything or portions of the power that they have been conferred.
 - To provide effects to this second delegation, the respective authorization, will be written in the granted power.

TITLE VII

MODIFICATION OF THE STATUTES

ARTICLE 42.- Formalities for the modification of the statutes: The present Statutes may be modified by the Board of Trustees as long as the requisites of quorum and majority established in Article 29 of these Statutes are complied with.

Additionally, when a convocation is made to deal with modification of the Statutes, citations must be made expressly, with indication of the article or articles to be modified and the corresponding proposals. The citation should be done in this case not less than eight weeks in advance.

The modifications of the Statutes agreed by the Board of Trustees will be communicated to the Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research (CGIAR). Failure to do this will invalidate these modifications.

The modifications of the Statutes that do not comply with the requirements established in the present article will be considered not done and will lack any legal effect.

TITLE VIII

REFERRING TO DISSOLUTION AND LIQUIDATION OF CIP

ARTICLE 43. - Requisites to Accede to the Dissolution. In the case that CIP is considered unable to continue operating effectively for significant reasons, the Board of Trustees may address its dissolution.
