

Mr. Rogers, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copies of Orders in Council passed under the provisions of the Relief Act, 1934, the Relief Act, 1935, as follows:—

Order in Council, P.C. 338, dated February 11, 1936: providing for a branch highway from the village of Dominion City, Manitoba, southerly to connect with Provincial Highway No. 3, not to exceed the sum of \$575,000.

Order in Council, P.C. 342, dated February 11, 1936: amending the provisions of Order in Council, P.C. 2241, dated September 15, 1934, respecting the cost of freight on live cattle shipped from dried out areas in the provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta to stock yards where abattoirs are located where the said cattle are to be slaughtered and converted into tankage or boneless beef, not to exceed the sum of \$969.56.

Order in Council, P.C. 352, dated February 11, 1936: authorizing payment to the province of Quebec of the sum of \$66.66 for relief settlement.

Mr. Dunning, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—List of shareholders of the Bank of Canada as at December 31, 1935, in conformity with the Statutes of Canada, 1934, Chapter 43, Section 35.

Mr. Rinfret, by leave of the House, introduced a Bill, No. 3, An Act to amend The Dominion Franchise Act, which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The House resumed the adjourned Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Slaght, for an Address to His Excellency the Governor General, in reply to his speech at the opening of the Session, and the proposed motion of Mr. Woodsworth in amendment thereto.

And the Debate continuing;
