#### PRAYERS

The Order being read for the second reading and reference to the Standing Committee on Broadcasting, Films and Assistance to the Arts of Bill C-5, An Act to establish the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission, to amend the Broadcasting Act and other Acts in consequence thereof and to enact other consequential provisions;

Mr. Pelletier (Hochelaga), seconded by Mr. Lalonde, moved,—That the Bill be now read a second time and referred to the Standing Committee on Broadcasting, Films and Assistance to the Arts.

#### (Public Bills)

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Douglas (Bruce), seconded by Mr. Lajoie, the following Bills were read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported without amendment, concurred in at the report stage, read the third time and passed:

Bill C-228, An Act respecting the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act,

Bill C-229, An Act respecting the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act,

Bill C-365, An Act respecting the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act.

The House resumed debate on the motion of Mr. Pelletier (Hochelaga), seconded by Mr. Lalonde,—That Bill C-5, An Act to establish the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission, to amend the Broadcasting Act and other Acts in consequence thereof and to enact other consequential provisions, be now read a second time and referred to the Standing Committee on Broadcasting, Films and Assistance to the Arts.
