Indeed that the Disadvantage to Trade in the control of the Disadvantage to Trade in the Undertakings of this Nature in particut, will be so great, that it is no great resumption to assert the Loss in both uses to be absolutely irretrievable.

THE Case therefore is widely different me the Notion which has in some Places ailed: And New England is not, and n sorry it is not, the powerful, slourish—Colony it has been represented to be; ut on the contrary, the Country is very poor, largely in debt, has no Currency or eal Value in it, and, unless speedily reved from hence, has no suture Prospect, but that of utter and irrecoverable Ruin.

It is not disposed to throw off its Dependency on the Crown of England; but may, with Justice, vie with England itself for Demonstrations of Loyalty, Zeal, and Affection to His present Majesty, the Protestant Cause, and English Liberty.

This Narrative (which is already much longer than I intended it should be) would have
