

APPOINT, *v. t.* 1st To name, fix, *Ies áum*

2d To appoint to an office, *Ies-téshilshem, Ies-tkôm, Ies-kolem.*

Appointed, Chosen to do anything for the appointer, is rendered by 'sgu' prefixed to the radical. My workman, 'Isgu-kôlem'; My overseer 'Isgu chitim'; 'My horse guard,' Isgutlaskâ-gue'.

APPRECIATE, *v. t.* *Ies-kutenêsem.*

APPRISE, *v. t.* To give notice, *Ies-minishitem, Ies-zânem, Ies-tzânem.*

APPROACH, *v. t.* 1st A place, *Ies-chehtiteminem.*

2d A person from the front, *Ies-chizilshem.*

3d A person from the side, *Ies-chsâgam.*

4th A person from behind, *Ies-nchizûchem.*

5th To approach gently, stealthily, *Ies-enêtem.*

6th To approach the water, a stream, *Chiznêtikui.*

APPROPRIATE, *v. a.* To take to himself, 1st as related to the person appropriating, is rendered by the personal pronoun. I, 'Ies-kôiem', Thou, 'As-annem', We, 'Knes-kaëmpilem'. See *Koic, Anui*, etc.

2d Referring to the act of appropriation, *Ies-kuném, Ies-kolsteém.*

3d Referring to the object appropriated, the object is made a verb instrumental; *v. g.* I appropriate to myself the house, 'Ies-zât-gum'; I appropriate to myself the roan horse, 'Gatlziremen sguâmkan'; I appropriate to myself the white blanket, 'Zize-men lu ipik'; You appropriated to yourself my cravat, 'Koskalépsemeltgu lu iskalêps'.

APPROVE, *v. t.* 1st To be pleased with, *Ies-gesteminem, Ies-cheesêsem.*

2d To agree, *Chin-zâti a.*

APT, *a.* 1st the passive aptitude is rendered by 'âtem' affixed to the radical, which usually reduplicates the last consonant.

Apt to be made, 'Kol'lûtem'; Apt to be seen, 'Uchehûtem'; Not apt to be caught, 'Tas az'zûtem'.

2d Aptitude to do anything is rendered by 'mûtem' affixed to the radical. Apt to do, 'Kolenûtem'; Apt to catch a horse, 'Azmûtem.

ARDOR, *n.* *Suililt.* See *Ul.*

ARISE, *v. i.* 1st from sitting, *Chines-téshilshi.*

2d From laying down, *Chines-gutlshi.*

ARM, *n.* *S'chuâgan.*
