

APPOINT. *v. t.* 1st To name, fix, Ies-áum

2d To appoint to an office, Ies-téshilshem, Ies-tkóm, Ies-kolem.

Appointed, Chosen to do anything for the appointer, is rendered by 'sgu' prefixed to the radical. My workman, 'Isgu-kólem'; My overseer 'Isgu-chítim'; 'My horse guard,' Isguthaská-gae'.

APPRECIATE, *v. t.* Ies-kuténélsem.

APPRISE, *v. t.* To give notice, Ies-minishitem, Ies-záunem, Ies-tzúinem.

APPROACH, *v. t.* 1st A place, Ies-chehtiteminem.

2d A person from the front, Ies-cházilshem.

3d A person from the side, Ies-cháságam.

4th A person from behind, Ies-nchiznichem.

5th To approach gently, stealthily, Ies-enétem.

6th To approach the water, a stream, Chiznétkui.

APPROPRIATE, *v. a.* To take to himself; 1st as related to the person appropriating, is rendered by the personal pronoun, I, 'Ies-kólem', Thou, 'As-anüen', We, 'Kaes-kaempilem'. See Koié, Anüi, etc.

2d Referring to the act of appropriation, Ies-kuném, Ies-kolsteém.

3d Referring to the object appropriated, the object is made a verb instrumental; *v. g.* I appropriate to myself the house, 'Ies-zít-gum'; I appropriate to myself the roan horse, 'Gatlzinenem-sgnámkam'; I appropriate to myself the white blanket, 'Zízenem-hu ipik'; You appropriated to yourself my cravat, 'Koskalépsemeltgu-hu iskaléps'.

APPROVE, *v. t.* 1st To be pleased with, Ies-gesteminem, Ies-ch-geesélsem.

2d To agree, Chin-záti a.

APT. *a.* 1st the passive aptitude is rendered by 'ütém' affixed to the radical, which usually reduplicates the last consonant. Apt to be made, 'Kol'lütém'; Apt to be seen, 'Uchhütém'; Not apt to be caught, 'Tas az'zütém'.

2d Aptitude to do anything is rendered by 'mütém' affixed to the radical. Apt to do, 'Kolemütém'; Apt to catch a horse, 'Azmütém.

ARDOR, *n.* Snailnilt. See UI.

ARISE, *v. i.* 1st from sitting, Chines-téshilsbi.

2d From laying down, Chines-gntilshi.

ARM, *n.* S'chuágan.
