

## MISTAKES MADE IN PAST YEARS

Rev. W. F. Wilson Says Mistakes of All Years Will Be Repeated Unless—

"I would sooner be the poorest man among you than take the place of some of the richest men in this city. It is no disgrace to be poor, but it is a disgrace to be rich as some of these men are."

Thus said Rev. W. F. Wilson, in an address at the Strand Theatre last night, revealing upon those present not to make the mistakes they had been making in the past of being discouraged because they apparently were not as well off as others. His address "Mistakes of 1912" was listened to by an audience of men who overflowed into the galleries. Music was furnished by the N. C. A. Orchestra and Male Quartet. Several songs were rendered by Arthur Blight.

Dr. Wilson said that the greatest mistake of 1912 was made in the beginning. Those who had begun with Christ had nothing to regret. Those who did not make the greatest mistake, in 1912, as in 1911, some had attempted to get along without Christ. The mistake of 1912 was that all the years would again be repeated this year unless the year was begun with a true sense of our best interests, a loyalty to Christ.
