

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL J^o.

An Act for the relief of Clara Soloway Rudy Sazant.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Clara Soloway Rudy Sazant, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, wife of Nathan Sazant, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Outremont, in the said province, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the twentieth day of November, A.D. 1955, at the said city of Montreal, she then being Clara Soloway Rudy, a widow; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Clara Soloway Rudy and Nathan Sazant, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Clara Soloway Rudy may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Nathan Sazant had not been solemnized.
