Dr. H. M. Ami of Ottawa Showed

Number of Views of Constantinople.

The speaker introduced his subject by giving a brief resume of diplomatic relations of Turkey and the Balkans during the past two years, after which Constantinople and the people of Turkey were described. The lecture was accompanied by a large number of beautiful lantern slides including views of all the most important buildings in Constantinople.

Dr. Ami spoke of the relations of Great Britain and Palestine, stating that the "metropolitan" of the British Empire, the birth town of Christ, would ere long undoubtedly rise to prominence with the aid of the British Empire.

UNIVERSITY SECTION

READY FOR THE FRONT

Full Quota Obtained and Fine Body of Men Will Represent Varsity.

The Toronto University section in the 7th battery of the Canadian Field Artillery is to be sworn in this morning by Col. B. C. Arnold of Ottawa. Following the receiving of the past week, Lieut. P. C. Ellis of Montreal was able to announce yesterday that the full quota of 64 men had been obtained for the Varsity section. They were a fine body of men, he declared, and would be a credit to the university. After the men have signed up they will leave for Ottawa, probably on Tuesday morning. Although nominally attached to the third contingent, it is understood that the unit will proceed to the front as soon as it is properly qualified. The university section will maintain its identity as the "University of Toronto section." The students will have their own non-commissioned officers.
