THE ST. LAWRENCE ROUTE.

The Steamship Iberian so Badly Damaged

That She Will Have to Stop for the Season.

She Will be Thoroughly Repaired During the Winter.

QUEBEC, Nov. 17.—The damages to the S. S. Iberian, which went ashore on Red Island Reef, are so serious that they cannot be repaired before the close of navigation. She will go into graving dock and be permanently repaired during the winter by Mr. Davies. The damage runs right through the boiler and engine space and extends two-thirds of the length of the vessel, a large quantity of rock being firmly wedged between the inner and outer bottoms. Much of the damage is caused by the general strength of the vessel.

The Protector of the Allan Line, which sailed from here for Liverpool early today, is the last mail steamer of the season from the St. Lawrence.

MORE PULP MILLS.

American Syndicate Buy Large Timber Limits

Situated on North Shore of Gulf of St. Lawrence.

They Will Export the Product to the American Market.

QUEBEC, Nov. 17.—William B. Kelso of Syracuse, N. Y., representing the American syndicate which has purchased the extensive lumber limits of the Gagnon Bros. at River Penitencot on the north shore of the Gulf, is in town on his way to the limits to select a site for the construction of saw and pulp mills. The company has a capital of \$500,000, and intends to manufacture pulp, deals, box shooks, etc., all the year round, and ship the products during the season of navigation by their own steamers to American ports on Lake Ontario.

THE RIVER STEAMERS.

The steamer David Weston, due here at four o'clock on Saturday from St. John, did not arrive until half past nine Sunday morning. She reached Sewells, seven miles below Fredericton, at half past four Saturday, at which time a thick fog prevailed and it was setting in very dark. Several tug boats were laid up there until such time as the weather should clear, and the captain of the Weston did not care to risk finding his way to this city in the thick weather then on. The steamer was consequently tied up for the night and the passengers on board, only four, were made comfortable. The steamer had a full cargo of freight and discharged it immediately upon arriving. Her trip down river today makes the ninety eighth round trip this season. The steamer will be kept on the route until the ice makes. Freight traffic is good, the steamer having full cargoes on every trip.

VICTIMS OF EXPLOSION.

NEW YORK, Nov. 17.—Frank O'Connor, 17 years old, died today from injuries sustained at the fireworks explosion in Madison Square election night. He is the fifth person to die as a result of that accident. Physicians at Bellevue Hospital said today that the death of James Fenton, colored, another victim of the explosion, is only a matter of a few days.
