miffion) is neither to propole, nor to accept, nor to reject laws, but to be refponfible for a fourth power, which is to be employed to execute. To this jealous fovereignty, of which the annual expence and mere civil lift will be at least a million sterling, * are to be added the paraphernalia of royalty without the dignity, and also the diffinctions of aristocracy, both in the parade of drefs and in privileges, beyond any that exifted under the profcribed monarchy: We may reafonably infer, that the tafte for democracy is much changed; and yet, to crown the whole, the occafional interference of the populace, under the name of primary affemblies, is added to this incoherent fystem.

§ 14. It was referved for the eighteenth century to fee a great and enlightened nation, in which All, who were not fhedding
