Track-laying Between Toronto and Bowmanville Will Be Rushed to Completion and New C. N. R. Gas-Electric Cars Will Probably Be Put On Route.

Work will be commenced to-day on the new Toronto and Eastern Radial line, which is to give a service along the lake shore between Toronto and Bowmanville. The survey has already been made, and a gang of men will at once be set to work on the grading, to be immediately followed by the laying of the rails. The construction is to begin from the Bowmanville end of the line.

The new line will connect with the Capadian Northern Railway at Cherrywood, twenty-two miles east of Toronto, and from there come in over the C. N. R. tracks. The track to be laid between Bowmanville and Cherrywood will be thirty-two miles in length.

It is the intention of the railway to complete the line this summer.

It is altogether probable that the new C. N. R. gas-electric car will be used on this line. The new car, which is run on an entirely new principle, can attain a speed of seventy-five miles an hour. On the recent experimental trip which this car was given between here and Trenton. a speed of over fifty miles an hour was attained during part of the trip without difficulty.


