WASHINGTON, Dec. 10. (Can. Press.)—Picturing the New York, New Haven & Hartford Railroad as a mighty monopoli controlling all New England railroad and coastwise steam-ship traffic as well as thousands of miles of electric lines, state and city officials of New England today appealed to the house rules committee to act favorably on the resolution of Representative O'Shaughnessy of Rhode Island to provide for a congressional investigation of the alleged deal between the New Haven, Grand Trunk, and Grand Trunk systems, through which work on the proposed extension of the latter, the Southern, New England Railway, has been suspended.
