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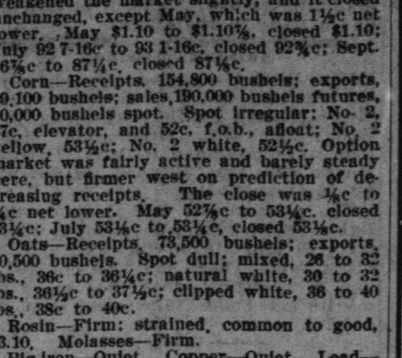

PAPERS EAT CORN

Findlay, Ohio, Dulles Blunted by Big Advertiser.

Findlay, April 7.—A large department store recently started in Findlay has succeeded in breaking up a so-called "protective association," said to exist among the local merchants.

To do this, the new store started slashing prices right and left. Last week they went to Postoria, which is connected with Findlay by trolley, and endeavored to get advertising in that city.

The Postoria papers refused to accept the "ads" and hand bills were hurriedly distributed throughout the town.

Coming back to Findlay at night, the advertising men went to the Findlay papers to hand in the Saturday copy of the new matter with a statement that the advertising could not be accepted, as other local merchants were combining and notified the newspapers that, in case the department store was allowed to run its advertising in the local merchants would absolutely refuse to use the papers as advertising mediums.

Already thoroughly aroused by the action of the Postoria newspapers, the answer from the department store was brief and straight from the shoulder.

"Very well, you will either accept our advertising matter or we will start a newspaper."

The Postoria newspapers, but they held their ground.

True to their word, the department store company immediately ordered negotiations for the introduction of a newspaper in Findlay.

Already the business managers very rapidly thawed, humbly requested that further action be deferred and that the advertising matter be turned over to them, which was done.

THE COST OF MAKING GAS. Figures Being Brought Out by N.Y. Investigators.

New York, April 7.—The actual cost of manufacturing illuminating gas in New York City was brought out for the first time to-day by the legislative committee, which is investigating lighting conditions in this city.

John A. Sanborn, bookkeeper for the New York Mutual Gaslight Company, testified that his company had supplied illuminating gas to the Consolidated Gas Company under contract, which provided that the Consolidated Gas Company should pay the actual cost of production and allow the Mutual a profit of 10 per cent. above that amount.

As the Mutual supplied gas to the Consolidated for 40 cents per thousand cubic feet, deducting the 10 per cent. profit, the actual cost of production approximately \$6.12 cents per thousand cubic feet.

In the examination of George W. Doane, vice-president and general manager of the New Amsterdam Company, it developed that while the company is capitalized at \$42,777,425 the actual value of the property held by the company is \$18,100,000. This includes plants, franchises, etc.

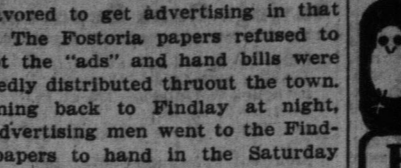
Mr. Doane explained that the remaining \$24,677,425 was the estimated value of the good-will of the company.
