RADIAL RAILWAY ENTRANCE

Property Commissioner Harris is Warm After Mr. Moore, Who Said Report Was Absurd.

Two bright young men are at daggers drawn in connection with the entrance of the radial railways into Toronto.

The manager of the radial, states that Commissioner Harris has absurd ideas about it.

W. H. Moore, manager of the Toronto and York Radial Railway Company, in criticism of my report relative to the financial terms upon which the radials should be admitted to the City of Toronto.

At a conference held in the mayor's office on July 16, Mr. Moore stated that in the event of radials entering the city, passengers would be transferred to the cars of the Toronto Railway system at existing termini.

My report, if adopted, will guard against the Toronto Railway Company, and the radial, operating body known as the Toronto Railway Company.

Mr. Moore in his utterance, carefully refrained from any reference to the 'freight' nature of the radial.

The manager of the radial company pretends to misconceive the proposition relative to a rental required by the city in respect of any space which the company might occupy at St. Lawrence Market.

"I have never made the statement that rentals at St. Lawrence Market are decreasing, indeed, the tendency is to the contrary."

"I repeat that Toronto is of more importance to the radial than radials are to the city, and that the company may appreciate the fact that in this matter they are not dealing with the municipality of East Toronto."
