> HISTORY OF THE BIBLE. Canon Welch's Address Before St. Cyprian's Church Class.

Rev. Canon Welch spoke before an appreciative gathering of the Bible and Manning-avenues. His address was a clear answer to "How Did the arrested has driven us further apart. Bible Get into Its Present Shape?" He explained that while all the books of the New Testament were written before A.D. 100, they were not all connected nor bound in one volume nor even recognized as Scripture, There were no original manuscripts extant and it was a fact of great significance that all copies had beer made by hand and were consequently more or less imperfect. Latin were the very first languages to which the Greek Testament translated. At a very early date, be-bore 200 A.D., the whole of the Bible was translated into Latin. Probably several persons were engaged in the translation. It was inevitable, therefore, that there should be many variations in the readings.

Canon Welch next dwelt on the work of St. Jerome, who was a Greek and Hebrew scholar, emphasizing the fact
