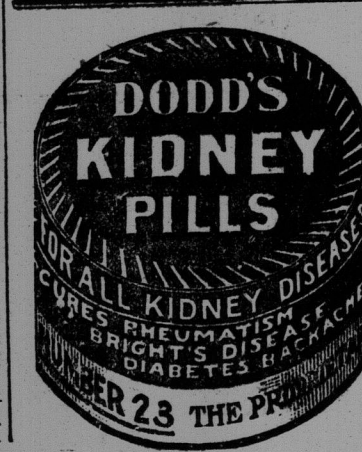

## Why The Turks Joined Germans

In the "Review of Two Worlds" an ex-Grand Vizier of Turkey contributes a long and highly interesting article on the authority of a former head of government, he tells how and why the Young Turks, or the Progressives, started out with special friendship for Britain, and how the British Empire, upholding Turkey's policy of "backing the Turk out of Europe, bag and baggage," and the alliance with Russia, destroyed that work, and increasing hostility to Turkish interests, as shown in Egypt and in the Balkan Wars, reduced the pro-British party to very unimportant proportions. The ex-vizier is not now a member of the Turkish government, and declares no predilection for any power.

The revolution that overthrew the Sultan Abdul Hamid was the starting of a new regime in Turkey. The Young Turks were in power, and their first act was to call old Kiamil Pasha to the viceroyship. Kiamil's chief merit was strong partnership for Britain. The new era of British friendship was the era of British friendship. The Young Turks discovered that the liberal Europe welcomed the Turkish constitution not as a means of bringing about Turkish regeneration, but as a means of separating Christian races from Turkey. The constitution was to be synonymous with disintegration. The British-French attitude was the same toward liberal Turkey as toward retrograde Turkey. In London and Paris, there was ill-temper at the purchase of two old German warships, and Germany showed friendship by making a partition of the Balkans. The "fact remains," says the ex-vizier, "that the Young Turks, who had been the allies of the British, found themselves in a sort of blind alley—closed by the line of the Balkans and the line of the Dardanelles, and the hatred in certain circles of Turkish regeneration by Russia's fear of seeing a strong Turkey rear her way to the Mediterranean; by England's fear of seeing that same Turkey reclaiming her legitimate rights in Egypt, etc." They turned to Germany.

## Not Religiously Antagonistic

After pointing out that Britain, France and Russia, which are large Moslem powers, are against constitutional or political freedom, or a sense of equality with Christian races, the ex-vizier says that if German Christianity was able to weather successfully this resulted solely because the Turks could not help but feel that Germany was not an enemy. Germany was not a supporter of the dissolute elements, nor a fanatical enemy of progress. Germany has been able to keep her political system free from religious fanaticism, and holds an impartial attitude toward the different religions of the world. She is not like the British, secular and Protestant, nor like France, secular and Catholic. She has the good taste not to use religion as a political tool, and to choose other trumpets for her diplomacy. It is therefore, not so much on account of a marked sympathy, but a marked absence of antipathy, that Germany has won her place in Oriental hearts.

## Seizing Two Turkish Warships

The ex-vizier says that Britain's act in seizing the two Turkish warships building for Turkey at the outbreak of this war was the culmination of a series of sinister attacks against Turkey. The British Empire, he thinks, to cripple Turkey against possible attacks by Greece, and the language used in the British press, therefore, was to show Turkey that it had nothing good to expect from the Entente. It was not surprising, therefore, that Britain should have seized the chance to buy the Goeben and Breslau. Moreover, Turkey thinks that it is strategically inconsistent for Britain to consider Egypt a belligerent on behalf of the Entente at the same time she demanded Turkish neutrality. Having everything to gain from a possible German victory, and nothing from an alliance which includes Russia, and Turkey's former protectors from Russia, the Ottoman Empire struggles on, knowing itself to be in a precarious position, but nevertheless, hoping for the best.

## CHECK USE OF NEUTRAL SHIPS

Flag Vessel is Registered Under Not to Count in Prize Courts—Real Ownership Will be the Test

The possibility of fleets of ships of neutral countries being purchased by Germany and operated for her benefit under neutral flags has been frustrated by a new order-in-council. This order abrogates Article 57 of the Declaration of London, which provides that the neutral or belligerent character of a vessel is determined by the flag it is entitled to fly.

The order-in-council succinctly states that it is no longer expedient to adopt said article. The ownership of the vessel is to be the test of its nationality. This was the rule followed by England and the United States before the framing of the Declaration of London. Your correspondent is informed that the denunciation of Article 57 will enable Great Britain to revert to that practice.

## ARMENIAN BISHOP TORTURED BY TURKS

"Shod" With Red Hot Irons—Men Tied in Fours and Taken to Slaughter

London, Oct. 28.—A long account by an eye witness of Armenian atrocities is telegraphed by the Reuters correspondent with the Dardanelles fleet. The statement is from an official source, the correspondent explaining that it was given to the British staff by an Armenian serving in the Turkish army who was the prisoner.

This account begins at Erzerum, the principal city of Turkish Armenia, last week. It covers reports about various parts of Armenia and gives details of various atrocities along familiar lines.
