**PLANNING FOR A FUTURE POLAND**

Poles in Paris—Discuss Their Country's Prospects

MUCH SUFFERING NOW

Germans Rob Peasants of Their Clothing—As Bad as in Belgium—War May Bring New Freedom

Paris, Feb. 22.—(Correspondence of Toronto News)—For some time there has been a forgerathering of Poles in Paris. They intend to keep in touch with their fellow countrymen in Great Britain and in America that they may have some plans for when they come into their own after the war. Three meetings were held here and there would have been more but the police refused to permit their continuance. I attended the third. The discussion was entirely in Polish, but much of it was translated for me. Their language did seem strange, as the speaker seemed to sneeze at the end of every word. I recognized the word conference, with a "ch" at the end of it. There, too, I learned the pronunciation of Przemysl, which sounds like Preem-ahl.

In addition to these gatherings, the Poles are meeting to hear discourses in French, dealing with the history and talent of their country, and their hopes for the future. At these lectures there is one speaker, while at the other gatherings to which I have referred, any Pole who wished to speak was permitted to do so. The lecturer is generally a Pole well learned in his subject, these meetings are quite within the law of Paris.

Speakers Were Restrained

At the gathering which I attended Count Carol Potocki was in the chair. He was quite reasonable in his utterances, and calm in his suggestions. Now that a new era seemed to be dawning for Poland, he pleaded for tolerance and forbearance on their own parts. They had, he said, at present only the accuracy and could not at once expect an oak tree. Only by moderation could they hope for the fruits of their efforts. The speakers referred to the vast territory originally belonging to Poland. From the Baltic to the Black Sea, from Prussia to the prairies of the Ukraine this area was their original kingdom.

A young man, the son of a Polish writer, spoke. His views were not tempered with restraint, as were those of the older men. He spoke very well in fluent Polish. I was told, but seemed to express the ideas of the Polish aristocracy, when they held so much power in the lower classes, what were little better than savages. Now there is the middle class drawn from both sides, and other professional men. If they are to have autonomy now it is this latter class which would comprise the majority of their governing body.

As Bad as in Belgium.

Poland has been subjugated for about 150 years. It would seem that a time of suffering had to be, to make the people more tolerant. That the Poles are intelligent no one doubts, but after being among them one wonders whether there is not too much cleverness rather than perseverance and determination. Their great ambition to regain their former greatness and independent position makes one sympathetic to them.

During the present war the suffering in Poland has been terrible. The winter is always severe and the misery and suffering this year in the invaded portions of the Black Sea, from almost as great as in Belgium. On account of the excessive cold even the poorest peasants wear roughly-made but warm fur coats. The Germans have not hesitated to take from them all the clothing desired for

**DO NATIONS GO CRAZY?**

(From the New York World)

In one day we have three expressions by high German authorities bearing upon the neutral rights of the United States—Ambassador von Bernstorff at Washington informs the State Department that unless we compel Great Britain to keep its hands off food intended for Germany's civil population, his country will begin a naval warfare based upon unprecedented practices. This seems to mean that we must become an ally of the Kaiser or take the consequences. Without establishing a blockade the German Admiralty reiterates the warning to all neutrals to keep out of "hot" waters on pain of being torpedoed "accidentally." This amounts to a declaration of war against the whole world.

The German Foreign Office admits that from the American viewpoint certain questions raised by this government as to Germany's proposal to run such are "quite justified," and yet it "adheres to its own viewpoint," which is that international law is played out, and it can see no reason why this should involve the United States and Germany in difficulties.
