WILL DEBATE WITH OXFORD.
Yale to Meet Englishmen in Contest at New Haven.

New Haven, Conn., June 9.—An international debate between Oxford and Yale universities to take place in New Haven probably in September is being planned, according to an announcement by the Yale University Debating Association. The debate will be on a subject of international importance, the cancellation of war debts having been suggested. A committee from the Yale Association has been designated to choose the subject.

The international contest was suggested in a letter from Oxford. In order to avoid a division along national lines, it is proposed that the English manner should be followed, this being that one American and two Englishmen compose one team with two Americans and one Englishman the other. The decision as to which university won would be based upon individual merits and not upon the team performances.

The Yale University Debating Association has also decided to organize an intercollegiate debating league next fall, which is planned to comprise Yale, Harvard, Princeton, Dartmouth, Bates and Cornell, with the possibility of Wesleyan, Brown and Columbia as charter members.
