Come to N. B. Farms Under  
Overseas Settlement  
Scheme

ARE SELECTED FOR  
LIFE ON THE FARM

R. I. Donaldson Has Been  
Overseas on This  
Mission.

More than 30 English and Scotch families with an average of about six to seven persons in each family, will come to New Brunswick this spring under the overseas settlement scheme which is being carried out with the assistance of the Soldier Settlement Board, and about 50 families are expected to come to the Maritime Provinces.

R. I. Donaldson, supervisor of the Soldier Settlement Board for the Maritime Provinces has been in England and Scotland for the last three months in the interests of the scheme and has been engaged in selecting and advising the would-be settlers. Mr. Donaldson called for Canada on Sunday, and is expected to arrive in St. John this week or early next week.
