- (b) In mitigation, the Defending Officer states that the accused took part in the Dieppe raid and was wounded. He later became a cook with the RCASC. He served in France, but became sick and was evacuated to England. Here he married a girl who claimed she was pregnant, but this turned out to be not so. He was unable to live in harmony with his wife. His first offence of AWL was caused by his desire to effect a reconciliation with her. She had stolen some money, and he wished to earn extra money to protect her. His second AWL was caused by his desire to catch his wife in misdemeanors, which he was told she was conducting.
