to have 2 rooms papered and two places in the roof repaired as some shingles were dislodged during the severe wind storm of last winter. I think this should be done.

There are no immediate assets, apart from Grants except produce from the garden and green house which has been well in advance of any previous year and some wheat and sugar beets which will be sold.

I am not yet instructed as to the method to be employed in financing the Institute. Will accountable cheques be sent to Mrs. Boyce from time to time, or will she submit vouchers on the Indian Trust Forms, and if so will they be signed by her or by me, and cheques in payment issued by the Department?

She at present signs cheques "A.M.Boyce, New England Company". Will she continue that account or close it out and open a new one under some other designation?

I think Mrs. Boyce should pay by cheque all accounts under headings named above (1) Fixed amounts, (2) Tradesmen's account, and render an itemized contingent account monthly, supported by vouchers as far as possible.

It also seems to me that some method of checking up her receipts should be adopted, as for instance sales of farm and garden produce. Mrs. Boyce tells me that she has to trust the gardner for his returns as he makes small sales on the Brantford Market and at other times which are impossible for her to verify. She does not doubt the correctness of these returns.

I enclose forms shewing the natere of Mrs. Boyce quarterly returns to the New England Company, the next one being to 30th Sept. She desires permission to continue that method for the present quarter and to be informed as to the nature of her future reports. She is willing to adopt any method of book keeping or returns which the Department may suggest.

There is an outstanding account of \$434.30 for a Power Sprayer which was necessary to enable them to plant and mature an extra large quantity of potatoes as well as to restore the
