BERLIN, Jan. 2.—The prospects for Germany in 1907 are by no means wholly gright. In regard to the foreign relations they are clearer than they were in the first half of 1906, during which war was more than once threatened; at present there is practically no cloud on the horizon, although there is palpable sensitiveness in Germany's relations with oil other countries except Austria which may on very slight provocation awaken a storm.

Respecting internal conditions the prospects are anything but reassuring, and it may well be that the empire is now at the zenith of her present cycle of prosperity.
