





The inquest lasted until 11 o'clock this evening, and details are lacking here owing to the difficulty of communication with Cooksville, Mrs. Nesbitt denied all knowledge of the affair when on the stand, as did also Mrs. Boyles and her husband, William Boyles." The inquest was conducted by Cor-oner J. M. Baird, Middle Sackville. Wm. Polly told of finding the body of the little girl beneath the earth in the cellar of the house occupied by the Boyles. 
