"BRICK" OWENS SAID TO BE SOME SURPRISE AFTER ALL



When word came that Umpire Hank O'Day had signed to manage the Cincinnati team, many a National League fan laughed and enjoyed the sensation. It was the first laugh the old leaguers had turned on Hank in the memory of the oldest player. The pleasure may be all the players' until next season opens and finds O'Day's shoes pre-empted by "Brick" Owens. This Owens person is some umpire. In the American association he is looked upon as the best little bat that ever made a rowdy player walk turkey. Owens has had a tempestuous career. In the American association his work was high class and he was absolute boss of the field when the game was in progress. Umpire batters always came off second best. Four years ago he went into serious trouble at Minneapolis by making a decision against the home club, in favor of Columbus—a play that had serious bearing upon the pennant race. The play occurred at the close of the season when both teams were fighting hard. Trouble between Owens and Mike Kelley, then manager of the Minneapolis club, led to Owens being charged with gambling on the games and the arbitrator was suspended pending investigation. He was exonerated and the following year was employed by the National league at the close of the American association season, making a splendid record. The following year an offer of \$55 a month took Owens back to the American association. He signed a three years' contract. Last fall the contract expired and he accepted President Lynch's offer in the National, in preference to working for Ban Johnson, who is after him. Owens went to the American association from the Western league six years ago. Blessed with a fine physique and a shock of hair from which he derived his nickname "Brick," it is a nervous player who will do more than mildly dispute his ruling, or think of rubbing his fist the wrong way. In addition to his physical advantages, Owens is a wit, as players who have tried to best him in repartee will testify. Like Tim Hurst and Tommy Connolly, he is humble of wit and sharp of tongue, while his voice, when making decisions, is of the fog horn variety that carries to the bleachers. And his real name is Clarence.

CHIPMAN BOXERS IN FAST BOUT WITH THE BOWLING LEAGUES

Chipman, Jan. 12.—I. R. Wilson has opened a gymnasium, and is giving lessons in boxing to a number of the young men of this place. A very interesting bout took place at the gymnasium last night, between Hayward Butler and William Orchard, two of Mr. Wilson's most accomplished pupils, who boxed five rounds. Much skill and science were shown by both the boys. Butler, who was the heavier of the two, had the advantage of Orchard at the beginning of the bout, and Orchard was forced against the ropes several times in order to get out of his way. Butler, however, weakened in the fourth round and Orchard succeeded in delivering a severe left hook to the nose, followed by a right to the stomach. Butler's nose bled freely, but he gamely came back in the fifth, and boxed skilfully to the end. Mr. Wilson, who refereed, gave the decision to Orchard on points. Arrangements are being made for another bout to take place next week.
