PROSPECTS OF GOVERNMENT CANDIDATES ARE GOOD

Kent County will Give Big Majority in Cause of Honest Administration

Richibucto, June 11.—The approach of nomination day finds the government prospects for an overwhelming majority in Kent County, particularly bright. The three candidates, Hon. D. V. Landry, Dr. Bourque and Mr. Sheridan are meeting with a most cordial reception in their tour of the county.

During the past week meetings have been held at Welford and Harcourt. In both these parishes the meetings were largely attended and most enthusiastic. Meetings were held at South Branch, Ford's Mills, Bass River and Harcourt.
