It claimed that these diseases were generally traceable to outsided districts, for which districts it desired a better system of quarantine and furmigation. There were 38 deaths last year—6 less than in 1913. Causes as follows: Tuberculosis, 8; heart diseases, 6; old age, 5; pneumonia, 4; cancer, 3; cholera infantum, 3; shronic bronchittis, hemorrhage of the brain, inantition, suffocation drowning, paralysis, marasmus, colits and septicemia, 1 each.
