Ottawa, June 30.—Immigration fig-ures for the last two months, the first two months of the fiscal year, show an increase over last year of thriteen per cent. The total immigration was 12. 791 as against 11,330 for the corres-ponding months in 1915. Only 1,601 came from Great Britain as compared with 2,697 last year but from the United States came 10,379 as compar-ed with 7,877 last year.


