rature, are exempt from any special examination in that language. The notes attained in their latest sessional examination will be accepted as counting for their Degree.

Candidates who succeed in examination on the *first* category, and partially succeed in those on the *second*, receive the Degree B. L.

Candidates who succeed in examination on the second category, and partially succeed in those on the first, receive the Degree B. S.

Candidates who are successful in examinations on both categories, receive the Degree B. A.

Gaining two-thirds of all attainable marks, and for each branch at least one-third the marks allowed for it, constitutes a successful examination. For English and Christian Doctrine, however, two thirds are exacted.

An examination is considered partially successful when the candidate gains one half of all attainable marks, and, for each branch, at least one fourth the marks allowed for it.

No student will receive a Diploma of any kind until such time as his indebtedness to the Institution shall have been satisfactorily settled.

N. B.—Former students, who graduated before the adoption of the present Programme of Studies, and who are desirous of receiving Degrees, will learn the conditions of their reception from the Prefect of Studies, with whom they should communicate by letter.

Bachelors of Art of three years' standing who desire to secure the M. A. Degree, will learn the conditions thereof by communicating with the Prefect of Studies. Generally, they will be required to present a thesis, the subject of which has been selected by the Faculty. This thesis should be presented before May 15th., and should be accompanied with the fee for the Diploma. In the case of the applicant's failure to secure the Degree, the fee will be returned.
