ALBERT THOMAS CHOSEN

He Will Be First Director-General of Labor Conference

Washington, Nov. 28.—Albert Thomas, the Conservative Labor leader of France, was selected today by the governing body of the International Labor Conference as the first director-general of the international labor office under the League of Nations.

Arthur Fontaine, of France, was selected as permanent chairman of the governing body.

Mr. Thomas was chosen to act provisionally until the governing body had been fully constituted, but it had been fully constituted, but it would serve for the next three years.

The International Labor Conference resumed its sessions today under the chairmanship of G. N. Barnes, of Great Britain, said was a "time scheduled."

The programme had been arranged with the idea of ending the conference's work tomorrow. The first subject discussed was the report of the special commission considering the application of eight-hour agreement to countries in the tropics and the Orient.
