How can winter feeding be done with greatest economy, and yet not to the detriment of the stock? They must have sufficient. We believe that all coarse fodders as straw and cornstalks, and even the coarser grades of hay, should be cut into short lengths and fed with meal, bran, middlings, etc. The one great benefit arises from the fact that the fodthe stock are done feeding. And even poor fodder, like straw, with sufficient gtain, can be made a complete ration, gtain, can be made a complete ration, and often at less cost than to feed the best hay. For horses, hay and oat straw can be cut together and fed with grain more economically and with better results than to feed hay alone. Another item is that the grain thus fed goes into the stomach in a light, porous condition variety in food. How is it with yourself Would you like a steady ration of pork, or of corn-bread or potatoes? If food lacking in carbon is fed continually, the fat in the body will be consumed; and if each and all elements required by the bones, the tissues, the nerves, etc, are not provided, weakness and non-fulfill-ment of their functions will necessarily ollow.
