1. EXTRADITION:—House resolves to go into Committee to consider certain Resolutions with reference to the Extradition from Canada of Fugitive Criminals; Considered; Reported; Agreed to, 237-239. Select Committee appointed to draft an Address to Her Majesty founded on the said Resolutions; Address reported, 239. Agreed to; Engrossed; Message to the Senate, requesting their Honours to unite in the said Address, 240. Message from the Senate stating they agree to the Address, and communicating an Address to the Governor General requesting that His Excellency will be pleased to transmit the Joint Address of both Houses to Her Majesty; House concurs in the Address of the Senate to the Governor General, and fills up blank with the words "and Commons," 268.

2. BOUNDARIES OF CANADA:—Resolution for an Address relative to the north-easterly, northerly and north-westerly boundaries of Canada, and declaring it desirable that an Act of Parliament should be passed defining the same; Considered in Committee, 255. Agreed to, 256. Referred to a Select Committee to draft an Address to Her Majesty founded on the said Resolutions; Address Reported, 256. Agreed to; Engrossed; Message to the Senate requesting their Honours to unite in the said Address, 257. Message from the Senate stating they agree to the Address, and communicating an Address to the Governor General requesting that His Excellency will be pleased to transmit the Joint Address of both Houses to Her Majesty; House concurs in the Address of the Senate to the Governor General, and fills up blank with the words "and Commons," 265.

3. PRINCESS ALICE, GRAND DUCHESS OF HESSE:—Message from the Senate with an Address to Her Majesty of condolence on the death of Her Royal Highness the Princess Alice, Grand Duchess of Hesse, 24.
