In making a report for the Industrial school for the month of Dec. I regret to have to say that a case of small pox developed in one of the pupils. Fortunately I saw the patient in the first stage of the disease and had him removed at once to an unoccupied house and quarantined there. I placed the school in quarantine and had all pupils that had not been recently vaccinated, vaccinated. I paid frequent visits to the school, watching the pupils closely and after the school had been in quarantine two weeks had the building fumigated thoroughly together with all wearing apparel and bedding used by pupils & staff. I then released the school from quarantine, but still have the patient and his attendant quarantined. I am pleased to say that there has only been the one case and that the disease in this patient has been of a mild type.
