With reference to your letter #23114-3 of August 11th, 1944, I wish to inform as to the work we propose doing with the \$1500.00 woted by the Band.

Roads. \$800.00

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The roads to be rebuilt and repaired are the main road running east and west through the reserve, it is about 9 miles long and it is used by all Indians and also it is the main road to the P.O. and Fort Qu'Appelle.

It will be necessary to purchase a few culverts but these can be bought locally when and if we need them the price will be at \$70.00 per thousant feed, there are many bad holes to be filled and also some regrading to be done, at the Band meeting it was decided to pay the following wages. Manual labor 35¢ per hour

Man and 2 horses 50¢ " " Man and 4 " 70¢ " " Time sheets will be kept

Time sheets will be kept and any lumber purchased will be vouchered for.
