



Sir,

Referring to your communication of the 18th ultimo, in regard to disposition of portion of the Woodstock Indian Reserve, I beg to say that the surrender which accompanied your letter has been duly accepted by His Excellency in Council, and I have to ask you to be good enough to ascertain and report the nature, extent and value of the improvements on the lands surrendered, by whom the same are owned, and what price you would place on the land, independent of the improvements, and whether Indians will accept payment of amounts placed on improvements.
