Would you be good enough to give me the names of your brothers and sisters who are still paid under your father's ticket. I have been doing my utmost to substantiate your claim, but the records here do not agree with the information given by Rev. Father Belleau who also has been doing what he can to clear up matters. According to information given by Father Belleau, had there been no deaths, there would be the following family:-

From the above you will see that according to the record there are only six of the family living, and your father has been paid for six of a family. He should have been paid for only five of a family, as Mrs. Iserhoff drew her own share for the years 1930, 31, 32; so the \$12.00 overpaid him will have to be retained from him next summer.
