With Cheque

Sir,-

Referring to previous correspondence, I beg to transmit herewith cheque No. 6051 for \$373.23 in favor of Mrs. J. Marsden, being her share of the Capital Funds of the Alnwick Band, which share is paid to her as an enfranchised Indian. When handing the cheque to Mrs. Marsden, you should caution her to use the proceeds thereof judiciously. In future Mrs. Marsden will not be paid any interest money as an Alnwick Indian and the number (56) by which she has been known on the pay-list should no longer be used, but allowed to be dropped from the pay-list. A note of explanation should appear in the pay-list and this letter and file number should be quoted. The girl adopted by Mrs. Marsden, who has up to the present been paid under No. 56 should be given a number of her own. She should be paid under the new number and under her own name in future. This letter and file number should be quoted in the pay-list as authority for payment to the girl and for the change indicated in the pay-list.
