1. If it is no the offer being made by the Canadian Government  
be no general application of this suggestion in view of the need  
for keeping military formations as far as possible on a fully  
overseas. For some time in fact certain work for the Canadian Corps  
in this country in the assembly of motor transport from Motor  
Corps has been carried out by Canadian civilian labour  
or are developing in other Dominions and that very recently the  
Government of the Commonwealth of Australia have informed us that a  
detailed investigation is being made into the Australian man-power  
situation with particular reference to probable voluntary enlistments  
for the Australian Imperial Force during the next two years. The  
Commonwealth Government have already reached the conclusion that  
certain proposals submitted to them by the United Kingdom for the  
expansion of their military forces are beyond their capacity. It  
would therefore appear that the measures suggested above for co-  
ordinating demands on Canadian man-power should be extended later  
to other Dominions.

2. If seems possible that in certain respects every limiting  
applies, some relief to the man-power problem in this country may be  
**DOMINIONS OFFICE,** applying to the employment of military personnel as allies on work which  
September, 1941. is primarily of a civilian character. To this end on suggestion  
of this sort has so far been made to the Canadian Government or  
Canadian military authorities. If it is unworkable, however, that it may  
need found possible for our own field volunteers who are  
to specific recruitment tasks or to civilian work requiring as  
result of all-round service. In specific cases the Canadian  
military authorities might offer compensation to this sort in order  
more fully to occupy those of whom in this country who have
