- New reserves. Unlike Samahquam & many other bands the Royal Com. apparently recognized these people were short of land & gave them three new reserves aggregating 515 acres. or (an acreage of about $5\frac{1}{6}$ per. cap.) see Report page 645 These with their old reserves raises the per. capita to nearly $13\frac{1}{2}$ acres. ^{However} the new reserves contain only a small amount of farming & very little of grazing land & therefore only in small measure meet the reasonable needs of the Inds. who therefore ask that some ^{additional} land be given them (see application below)

- Cut offs *vs.* none.
Chief obstacles to progress.

1. Shortage of farming land
2. " " " pasture
3. Lack of irrigation water
4. Lack of assistance for roads, bridges & clearing ~~land~~ or improving lands.
