I told Coulter that he could familiarize himself with the plane when he was riding with Dugans, however I made it clear to him that he could come to Saskatoon and take his dual flying from Mitcheson or if Chasmar was not attending University at the time he could give him lessons which would be free, and Coulter phoned me one day and had me make arrangements for him at Saskatoon to take instructions but this he never carried out.

I don't know what arrangements he made with Dugans with regards to taking instructions off his farm.

I also told Coulter that he must get a license before he could fly in and out of an Airport.
