THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 25, which has not been homesceaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-matter section of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY

Entry may be made personally at the local laud office for the District

in which the land to be taken is s'tuate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee entry. entry, of \$10 is charged for a homestead

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted entry for a homestead is required the provisions of the Dominion nds Act and the amendments ereto, to perform the conditions anected therewith, under one of following plans:—

of following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three

years,

(2) If the father (or mother, if
the father is deceased) or any persch who is eligible to make a homestead entry upon the provisions of
this Act, resides upon a farm in
the vicinity of the land entered for
by such person as a homestead,

the vicinity of the land entered for lev such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent nay be satisfied by such person tesiding with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner prescribed by this Act and has obtained active the properties of the patent countersigned in the manner prescribed by this Act and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestend. stead.

in the vicinity of the first home-stead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or connecting township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or the provisions of Clauses (2) (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 commodation, and have besides 80 comply with the steader who fails to comply with the steader who fails to the homesteader land had the land may be again thrown open for carry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years, before the Local Agent, Suh-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six Commissioner of Dominion Lands months notice in writing to the at Ottawa of his intention to do so,

INFORMATION.

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winnipeg, or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, information as to the lands that are open for certry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing lands to suit them. Full information respecting the land, tuber, coal and mineral them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Domin-ion Lands in the Railway Belt in Fritish Columbia, may no obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa; the Commissioner of Im-migration. Winnipeg, Manitoha; or to any of the Dominion Lands Agents in Manitoba or the North-west Territories.
