of 'saint' bandied among one another doubtedly losing some of her hold upon the upper classes, who are growing more indifferent to her Sabbaths and her ordinances. I see her producing little real effect on the working-classes, who are the great mass of the nation, not 10 per cent. of whom attend her churches. I see her standing with weak hands and feeble knees in the great battle against the master-fiend of drink, or even siding with his champions or palliating his intolerable enormities; and others saying smooth things and prophesying deceits. Let those others, if they will, prop tottering walls with untempered mortar. There are plenty of them to do it and to be rewarded for it. I will not."




