Mercantile Summary.

BUILDINGS to the value of one million dollars have been erected in Toronto within the past seven months.

THE ASSESSED value of property in Toronto is \$29,663,983 showing an increase of over \$2,668,-232 over the assessment of last year.

IMPORTATIONS of dry goods at Montreal for May, were valued at \$316,784, this year, and \$322,296 last year.

THE total importations of the Dominion for March, 1871, were \$7,530,896, against \$6,132,744 last year, showing an increase of \$1,398,152. In exportations there was a slight decrease, the total being \$2,587,627 this year, and \$2,606,732 last
