Committee appointed for that purpofe Charles Dickson Elqr; returned as a Member for the Town of Onflows took the usual Oaths and his Seat.

The Solicitor General moved, That the House proceed to a consideration of the Laws relating to the Impost and Excise, which are near expiring.

Ordere.laccordingly, and the Clerk proceeded to read the feveral Laws relative to those Duties.

Mr. Wallace thereupon moved, that a Committee of Seven be appointed to take into Confideration the feveral Laws relative to the Revenue of the Province, and to report thereon as expeditioufly as poffible.

Voted accordingly, and Mr. Wullace, Mr. Day, Col. Perkins, Mr. Dean, Mr. Schwartz, Mr. Dight, and Mr. James were appointed a Committee for that Purpose.

Mr. Day requested that the Refolves of the late House of Assembly, relative to the repair of Roads, which passed the Third of July, One Thousand Seven Hundred and eighty One, be read; read accordingly; and thereupen moved, that the Treasurer be defired to lay before the House an Account of all Monies paid by him for defraying the Expences of repairing Roads and Bridges, agreeable to those Resolutions, and how the Expenditure thereof has been accounted for,

Mr. Belcher requested that the Resolves of the House which passed the Twenty First of June, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty One, relative to the Payment of the Members for their Travel and Attendance on the Business of the House be read, which being done.

He gave Notice, that he intended at a future Day to move a like Refolution of this Houfe in Favor of the Members thereof.

Major Barkley moved for leave to bring in theHeads of a Bill, enabling His Excellency the Governor to appoint Commissioners in the feveral Counties and Towns within the Province, for the Trial of Criminal Offences, which come under the Denomination of Petit Larceny.

Leave given accordingly.

The Solicitor General moved, that a Committee of five be appointed to take into Confideration the Table of Fees, and to report fuch Alterations and Amendments, as they may find to be reafonably neceffary.

Ordered accordingly.

Committee appointed, Major Barkley, Col. Lawrence, Col. Perkins, Mr. Pyke, and Mr. Dickson.
