WANTED
4000 Cords of
Box Wood
AND
One Million Feet of
LOGS
—St. John, N. B., Oct. 12.—A dis-
astrous fire broke out at the mill this
morning and destroyed one-half of the
main street. Forty buildings are in ashes,
and the loss is estimated at more than
\$200,000. The Catholic church was
burned.
—Halifax, N. S., Oct. 13.—The Nova
Scotia Underwear Company's mills, situ-
ated at Eureka, Pictou County, were
totally destroyed by fire on an early
this morning. The fire originated in the
picker room, but how, is unknown.
About 50 men were at work at the time,
the flames had got into some oily material
and spread rapidly, and within a couple
of hours the plant was in ashes. A consid-
erable quantity of goods was removed, but
two carloads of wood were destroyed.
There was \$150,000 insurance. One
hundred and fifty men were employed
who had been working night and day on
wood orders and only yesterday garments
valued at \$30,000 were shipped to the
Canadian government.
—Harvey Station, Oct. 13.—The farm
barns and outbuildings of Joseph Mc-
Cutcheon, at Upper Magaguadavic, were
totally destroyed last evening by fire.
It seems that J. R. Jamieson had been
there with his threshing machine, and a
number of men during the day threshing
grain, and had left shortly before the fire
started. The machine and several hun-
dred bushels of oats and other grains
threshed and unthreshed were burned,
also a considerable quantity of hay and
two valuable horses were destroyed.
It was with considerable difficulty that
the dwelling house was saved. The loss
is estimated at about \$2,000, and it is said
that there is no insurance. The origin of
the fire is not known.
