HEAVY BOOTY CAPTURED BY SAFE-BREAKERS IN AN OHIO TOWN.

A DESPERATE GANG AT WORK IN THE VICINITY OF WHEELING.

BEREA, Ohio, Oct. 26.—One of the boldest safe robberies ever perpetrated in this vicinity occurred early today.

IRON AT KITCHENER STATE OF BUSINESS

DEPOSITS OF GREAT EXTENT AND OR REMARKABLE QUALITY.

MR. HILL, THE ORIGINAL LOCATOR, NOW VISITING THE CITY.

C. Plummer Hill, of Kitchener, is in the city this morning. Mr. Hill requires no introduction to all the old residents of Rossland, being himself one of the first men in the Kootenay country.

The extent of the iron deposits at Kitchener is remarkable. The lead, for such is the apparent formation in which the iron occurs, has been traced by open cuts distant a hundred yards or so from each other for no less than seven miles.

Mr. Hill was the original locator of the property, his stakes having been driven almost nine years ago. He believed that the iron was a capping covering a copper deposit, and from time to time expended a total of \$22,000 in opening up the claims and in assessment work.

Since then the work of development has continued steadily. A force of 30 men is employed at the present time exclusively in prospecting the deposit. It is proposed to sink a couple of shafts and drive tunnels at several points on which work will be continued all winter.

The ore found at Kitchener is genuine red hematite of excellent quality for commercial purposes. It carries on an average 65 per cent of iron, with a small percentage of silicates and only a trace of phosphorus and sulphur.

It is difficult to say at this juncture to what use the property may be put. One utility it will serve is that of furnishing a flux for silver-lead ores. Its greatest importance, of course, would be in connection with the establishment of steel works. This is far in the future, however, and time will be required to answer the query.

A STEADY DEMAND FOR GOODS AND GENERALLY BRISK TRADE.

GRAIN IS MOVING FREELY AND DOCK BUSINESS IS ACTIVE.

TORONTO, Oct. 25.—There have been heavy receipts of freight at Montreal this week owing to the approach of the close of navigation, and the shipping business has been very active.

At Quebec business in general has been fairly active during the past week, particularly provisions, which as a rule are in active demand at this season.

There has been a good steady trade in wholesale circles at Toronto this week. The volume of sorting orders for the current season has been numerous and called for a variety of lines, including a very large representation of high class goods.

Business at Hamilton, as shown by Bradstreet's reports, continues quite brisk. There is an active sorting trade being done in seasonal lines, and the jobbers are busy filling orders for various parts of the Dominion.

Reports of trade at the Pacific coast continue of a fairly satisfactory nature. The trade with the Klondike is now practically over for this season, and the large shipments of cattle to Dawson have dropped off.

Business at Winnipeg, as represented to Bradstreet's by reliable reports, is active as a result of the larger movement in wheat. Trade money circulation is increasing and payments are daily improving.
