RATION MUST BE REDUCED.

Cablegram from Lord Rhonda Tells of Situation Among Allies.

The following cablegram indicating that the food situation in Great Britain, France and Italy is far more serious than is realized by the people of this country, has been received by the Food Controller from the British Ministry of Food:

"The meat situation in the United Kingdom continues acute. Supplies of fats are inadequate. Imports supplies are low and an increase is urgently needed. A local rationing scheme is being authorized by the Ministry of Food, but the ration contemplated by us will have to be reduced.

"In France the bread card scheme was put into force on Jan. 29th with a bread ration per capita per day of three hundred grammes. It is proposed to adopt a general food card. The available supplies of meat are small. Butter is obtainable and milk supplies are satisfactory. Eggs are scarce. The situation is unchanged so far as oils and fats are concerned.

"In Italy, in the first place there is extreme need of cereals and secondly, of meat, dried fish and fats. For many months the sugar and bread have been rationed in Italy, the consumption of meat severely restricted and public meals controlled.

BRITISH CASUALTIES LIGHTEST IN MONTHS.

LONDON, Feby. 18—Casualties in the British ranks reported during the week ending today totalled 4,106 divided as follows:—

Killed or died of wounds—Officers, 38; men, 1,005.
Wounded or missing—Officers, 119; men, 2,944.

British casualties reported in the week just ended reached the lowest total recorded in many months.

BEAN GROWING IN NOVA SCOTIA.
