The Canadian Elevator Company has now in course of erection eight elevators, along the line of the G.T. P., at the following towns: Venn, Waterous, Young, Nokomis, Landis, Quinley, Redford and Scott. Ten other elevators will be built very shortly by the same company at other towns along the line, but the locations have not yet been determined upon. These elevators are of a uniform size, of 30,000 capacity. Each of the elevators is to be painted in harmony with the colors used by the G.T.P. on the stations, so that the appearance will be pleasing to the eye. It is the intention of the company to have the elevators complet-
