The strategic value of Prevesa to the Turkish division in Albania is that as long as it remains in the hands of the Turk; it makes possible a steady line of munitions and fool supplies. On the other hand the Greek troops could be revictualed by sea. It is stated here in well informed circles that the Eastern squadron of the Greek fleet which will shortly be refinored by the Iron clad Spetzal, is planning an important movement.
